**1. Welcome and Introduction**

No comments or concerns were brought forward about the June 13th meeting.

**2. Community Complaints including Odour and Dust Complaint Process**

The total number of complaints YTD 2025 was presented.

SMC Reviewed the odour and dust complaint investigation procedure and analysis process used at the plant.

Discussions were had about providing historical data for odour complaint and tracking at a future meeting, and the variations of aspects outside of SMC operations such as weather conditions, human perception, other odour sources, and MECP involvement in complaints.

Reminder; Complaints that 'Mention Health' are counted when a resident calls with an odour complaint and highlights that they have a health concern. They are not separate complaints received by the plant.

The complaints table and graph now indicates which complaints indicated Cementitious materials and which did not.

**3. Alternative Low Carbon Fuels Update**

St Marys Cement reviewed quantities of fuels used since starting ALCF in 2024 and highlighted equivalent quantities for frame of reference.

**4. Questions Brought Forward in Advance**

SMC reviewed 4 questions provided in advance to SMC surrounding POI calculations, emissions testing, long term health concerns, and air quality alerts from global events.

## **5. Round Table**

Fred noted he was surprised at the number of complaints due to the decreased odour he's experienced.

Jim also noted odour was detected less and was less strong.

Roger asked if there was any report SMC could do about emissions and values.

Jim noted the committee appreciates the questions brought forward by residents.
